The Lincoln Public Library is a municipal library that serves the roughly 48,000 residents of Lincoln, California. Lincoln is on historic Nisenan land, and settlement by European Americans began in 1859. Lincoln has a long history of valuing libraries, with a Carnegie Library being built in 1909 and serving the community for over a century. The Lincoln Public Library at Twelve Bridges, which opened in 2007, is a joint-use facility with the Twelve Bridges High School and now serves as the only branch of the Lincoln Public Library System.

The Lincoln Public Library chose to focus on Mental Health for the 2021 Book to Action program. Considering the COVID-19 pandemic and its many changes to daily life, library staff continued to hear and see that there was a profound need for our community to learn about and access mental health resources. The Library forged new partnerships with William Jessup University and Kaiser Permanente based on both agencies' commitment to mental health support for their constituencies. The book title that the Book to Action program centered around was Group: How One Therapist and a Circle of Strangers Saved My Life by Christie Tate. This title was chosen for its emphasis on the value of community and connection. Programming included a self-directed collection of mental health resources and activities hosted on Beanstack; virtual book clubs; a virtual visit from Christie Tate; online lectures on mental health and exercise and mental health and communities of color; and story times and take-home activities focusing on emotional regulation.




Image 1 Caption: Lincoln Public Library Book to Action 2021 Flyer
